



### The Schuylkill River Watershed




### The Schuylkill River Watershed

- Drinking water source for over 2 million people
- Largest tributary to the Delaware River
- 2,000 square mile watershed
- 130 miles long river
- 11 counties
- 235 individual municipalities
  - 154 MS4 municipalities





#### MS4 Municipalities in the Watershed




#### Schuylkill Action Network (SAN)
